## From the Director

Tex Sample Blue Collar Resistance & the Politics of Jesus: Doing Ministry with Working Class Whites The word "journey" gets bandied about so much in religion/spirituality circles these days that one hesitates



to use it. It gets used (some, I would suspect, say *over*-used) because it somehow describes our lives as we experience them in this period in time. It is certainly one way of describing the life of this resource center over the past nine months or so. Here are the highlights (maybe "lowlights" would be more descriptive): On January 30th we were to close immediately to the public because of air quality issues in our basement location., to move within thirty days and, in order to protect our collection, it needed to be cleaned off the premises.

We explored other location options, always with an eye toward maintaining our links with the seminaries and our return to the campus of Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond when renovations there are complete. That is expected to happen sometime in 2007. We found no viable options. Then in mid-June the door opened, quite literally, to an upstairs location in Ginter Park Baptist Church, subject to verification that our collection was "clean". That verification came on July 29th, but cleaning of the new space awaited us in August. By the time this newsletter reaches you, all of our collection will have been moved from the storage/cleaning area.

As we moved through winter and spring, it felt to us a lot like wandering in the wilderness. We continued serving those patrons who took the time to call us about their needs, and we delivered to their doorstep, to their church, or met them by appointment in our parking lot. In that sense, we never completely closed, but it took a bit longer to locate resources amidst the hundreds of boxes! Beyond that, however, we used the time to make two important decisions. First, in order to expand service to patrons, and in response to frequent suggestions through the years that we open branches in other locations, we established two satellites, each staffed one day a week: Mondays at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in Mechanicsville, and Wednesdays at Manakin Episcopal Church in Midlothian. Both locations are being used on a steadily growing basis. On Tuesdays and Thursdays our "base" location at Ginter Park Baptist Church is now open.

Second, in consultation with marketing consultants, we decided to give up on our too-long name that most folks couldn't remember, and that didn't fit on standard address labels - - and to change it officially to something much shorter: *The Resource Center, Inc.* So far the new name has met with enthusiastic approval! Over the next few months we will schedule several Open House events, daytime and evening, to welcome our patrons to our new locations, under our new name. The dates will be announced as they are set; watch our website, which is also oundergoing a transformation: <u>www.resourcingchurches.com</u> or contact us at <u>resourcecen-</u> ter@cavtel.net.

All in all, if not a journey, it's certainly been a trip! We've not travelled far in terms of miles, but a great distance in terms of endurance, flexibility, appreciation for our patrons, and commitment to this ministry of resourcing. It has been suggested that the early church's first resource was the Holy Spirit. If you asked our Board of Directors, or our staff, what kept us going through the long months, I suspect all would agree: it was the Holy Spirit who kept us on task. For me, the Spirit spoke personally through a quote that came across my desk via e-mail in mid-August: *Hope is the feeling you have that the feeling you have isn't permanent*. And it wasn't. My despair during the wilderness wanderings is over, and hope lives again. Or, to put it another way - - we're back! Our shelves are full of new resources and the coffee's on - - so, y'all come!

#### Consider This: Occasional Reviews

A great many resources come across my radar screen; some of them appear exciting and promising at first glance - - and sometimes they are. Others, I must admit, just don't grab my attention. One such genre is "Christian" fiction for adolescent girls. Not that I didn't hold writers who go there in utmost respect, because teens, male or female, are a tough crowd. However, I'd agreed to review one such book - - Dandi Daley Mackall's *grace notes*, the first in Zondervan's "faiThGirLz!" series. My deadline was at hand so at 7:30 this morning I propped myself up in bed with a cup of coffee and began reading and making notes. Two hours later I closed the book, looked at the clock and understood why I was hungry.

Mackall and Zondervan are onto something here. I liked Gracie Doe aka Jane Doe from the beginning of the book - - Gracie who lives her life through her blog, "That's What You Think". An apt observer of human nature and a talented writer, Gracie uses her blog to comment on her school, its teachers and her classmates, and members of her blended family. But she also uses it to hide from the world, to keep everyone at a safe and emotionally-manageable distance. Her blog catches on and her audience grows, but it also causes pain for some of her readers and she comes close to losing her blog site, her anonymity, and some potential friends . Along the way she learns some important things, like how our differing gifts matter and should be valued, that she doesn't need to go it alone, and that we can use our gifts in ways that build community or not. And while the author finds a way to talk about Paul's notion that all the parts of the body are important, she isn't heavy-handed about it.

As a pastor and teacher I have always found teens interesting human beings; as a grandmother of seven teens the cup of my life overflows. But I worry about them in this high tech world in which they race toward adulthood. Their fascination and nonchalant proficiency with cyberspace amaze and terrify me. Adults need to be paying attention to issues of internet safety as their kids venture out into the online world. Zondervan's faiThGirLz! Series is worth looking at for that reason alone. Subsequent titles in the series, which follow Gracie and her friends, are: *love, annie, just jazz,* and *storm rising*. Parents could find this series a useful way to initiate conversation. Professional educators, youth ministers, anyone working with teens in the church, might consider this series for a teen or "tween" book club or discussion group.
