These are times that call for Christians, indeed, all persons of



We live ... in the intersection of a cultural and religious tension. We are people of the present day, eager to embrace the many discoveries and possibilities that a new century holds. We are also part of a religious community of saints that stretches backward through thousands of years and across many cultures and continents. Negotiating these two realities is a daily challenge of discipleship and faithfulness. We teach the faith in the midst of this challenge to persons who are caught in the same tension. Somehow, we must find ways to communicate "the old, old story" to hearts, minds, and ears trained to hear only

what is new.

good will, to witness to their values. As this is being written, Rutgers Women's Basketball Team members ARE VOICING their "hurt, anger, and disgust" at the way they were referred to by popular radio personality Don Imus on national network radio. A few days earlier politician Newt Gingrich insulted Spanish speakers by referring to their language as "the language of the ghetto". At the heart of these widely publicized events are racism, sexism, and an utter insensitivity and absence of respect for others.

All of this, of course, is played out against the worst of our culture's devotion to wealth and power, for both are to be easily found in belittling others. It is important to remember that those who engage in such disrespect are well supported for their behavior, and surely many who consider themselves "good Christians" are among those who applaud them.

Is there a better way for Christians to go? One denomination, the Baltimore-Washington Conference of The United Methodist Church, has brought a rabbi on staff. Why? Rabbi Joshua Martin Siegel explained in a recent interview on National Public Radio, "I think the essence of spirituality is humility, the capacity to truly listen to and respect and love others." Noting that Jesus called for loving enemies, he added "that's the heart of the issue. Who's at the center? You? Or is it something larger than yourself to which you owe allegiance, to which you must give deference and try to follow its ways." Rabbi Siegel's presence among United Methodists helps them to remember.

At The Resource Center we try to remember. Our mission statement is "to resource churches, schools, agencies, and individuals for ministry in a diverse and everchanging world. Behind that brief statement are two core values that have guided our ministry since our doors opened in 1985: a profound appreciation for the diversity of God's world, and the imperative to practice Biblical hospitality - - a radical respect for every child of God.


